SACRAMENTS

Infant Baptism: Normally celebrated on a Saturday at 3:00 p.m. Baptisms also may be celebrated during Holy Mass (except during Holy Week). Please contact Deacon Jim (757-898-5570) to schedule. Parents are required to complete a Baptismal Preparation session prior to a Baptism; these are presented on the first weekend of January, March, May, July, September and November following the 11:00/11:30 a.m. Mass. Session dates may be adjusted due to holidays. Session dates and location will be posted in the bulletin.

Confirmation: This Sacrament fortifies us in the power of the Holy Spirit for a full experience of human living. Confirmation is conferred normatively upon teens in their sophomore year or through the RCIA process for all those, children or adults, who are converting into the fullness of the Catholic faith. Sincere preparation must precede the reception of this beautiful Sacrament.

Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament of the sick may be received after weekday or weekend Masses with prior notice. The Sacrament may also be celebrated in the Parish Office or with a personal visit to a home or care facility.

Sacrament of Marriage: Couples called to the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the Parish Office at least 6 months prior to the desired wedding date. Please make no firm arrangements until after meeting with the Deacon/Priest.

Each and every Mass is not something private, even if a priest celebrates it privately; instead, it is an act of Christ and of the Church. "For even if the faithful are unable to be present, it [Holy Mass] is an act of Christ and the Church" (Saint John Paul II, Presbyterorum Ordinis, n. 13). In offering this sacrifice, the Church learns to offer herself as a sacrifice for all and she applies the unique and infinite redemptive power of the sacrifice of the Cross to the salvation of the whole world. For every Mass that is celebrated is being offered not just for the salvation of certain people, but also for the salvation of the whole world. (Saint Paul VI, Pope Mysterium Fidei 1965 n. 32)

DIOCESAN YOUTH CONFERENCE 2023

The Diocesan Youth Conference (DYC) is an annual weekend event that gathers high school youth from Diocese of Richmond parishes in one central location. DYC is a highly energetic and engaging opportunity for our high school teenagers to gather as a larger Church community and celebrate the richness of our Catholic faith.

The Diocesan Youth Conference will be held on Friday, February 10 through Sunday, February 12, 2023 at the Greater Richmond Convention Center in Richmond, Virginia.

The theme this year is **From the Rising of the Sun to its Setting**, based primarily on Eucharistic Prayer III and Psalm 113 and drawing inspiration from Isaiah 60:19, Luke 1:76-79, and John 1:38-39. It can often seem in this life, that there is nothing but change. One day its raining, and the next there isn't a cloud in the sky; one day we are filled with laughter and the next we are overflowing with tears. But every day we know the sun will rise and that the sun will set – although life is marked by change, it is also marked with constancy.

The registration fee will cover lodging on Friday and Saturday evenings. Saturday breakfast, lunch and dinner as well as Sunday breakfast and a box lunch Sunday are included. A late-night snack on Friday and Saturday as well as a conference T-shirt are also included in the registration fee. The total cost is \$167. A \$50 deposit is due along with the registration form (located in the RE hallway) by Sunday, November 27. Final balance is due by Sunday, January 22, 2023. Questions?
