SACRAMENTS

Infant Baptism: Normally celebrated on a Saturday at 3:00 p.m. Baptisms also may be celebrated during Holy Mass (except during Holy Week). Please contact Deacon Jim (757-898-5570) to schedule. Parents are required to complete a Baptismal Preparation session prior to a Baptism; these are presented on the first weekend of January, March, May, July, September and November following the 11:00/11:30 a.m. Mass. Session dates may be adjusted due to holidays. Session dates and location will be posted in the bulletin.

Confirmation: This Sacrament fortifies us in the power of the Holy Spirit for a full experience of human living. Confirmation is conferred normatively upon teens in their sophomore year or through the RCIA process for all those, children or adults, who are converting into the fullness of the Catholic faith. Sincere preparation must precede the reception of this beautiful Sacrament.

Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament of the sick may be received after weekday or weekend Masses with prior notice. The Sacrament may also be celebrated in the Parish Office or with a personal visit to a home or care facility.

Sacrament of Marriage: Couples called to the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the Parish Office at least 6 months prior to the desired wedding date. Please make no firm arrangements until after meeting with the Deacon/Priest.

The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass

Christ is always present to his Church, especially in the actions of the liturgy. He is present in the sacrifice of the Mass, in the person of the minister (it is the same Christ who formerly offered himself on the cross that now offers by the ministry of priests) and most of all under the Eucharistic species. He is present in the sacraments by his power, in such a way that when someone baptizes, Christ himself baptizes. He is present in his word, for it is he himself who speaks when the holy Scriptures are read in the Church. Finally, he is present when the Church prays and sings, for he himself promised: Where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there in their midst. (Sacrosanctum Concilium, nn. 7-8. 106)

THE LORD IS COMING

Reflection on Matthew 11:2-11

A message of hope resounds through the readings for this third Sunday of Advent. Isaiah's word of hope came nearly three millennium ago to people suffering the turmoil and indignity of invasion by the Assyrians: Fear not! You will see the glory and splendor of the Lord who will come to save you! James encourages his community with yet more words of hope: Be patient! Do not lose heart! The Lord's coming will be soon!

And the message of hope comes to us in the response of Jesus to John's questions from a Galilean jail. John, who proclaimed the coming wrath of God and pointed to the One coming who is stronger than he, now sits in Herod's prison awaiting death because he spoke truth to power. Is John questioning his life's work? Perhaps, to a degree, but his guestion to Jesus: "Are you the one?" sets up the response of Jesus, a hope-filled message describing what His ministry will look like: the blind see, cripples walk, lepers are cured, the deaf hear, the dead are raised to life, and the poor have the Good News preached to them. Echoing the dream and vision of Isaiah and all the prophets, the Kingdom of God comes to rule our hearts and the world. We who are privileged to be least in God's Kingdom continue this mission and message of hope.


