SACRAMENTS

Infant Baptism: Normally celebrated on a Saturday at 3:00 p.m. Baptisms also may be celebrated during Holy Mass (except during Holy Week). Please contact Jennifer Strash (757-898-5570) to schedule. Parents are required to complete a Baptismal Preparation session prior to a Baptism; these are presented on the first weekend of January, March, May, July, September and November following the 11:30 a.m. Mass. Session dates may be adjusted due to holidays. Session dates and location will be posted in the bulletin.

Confirmation: This Sacrament fortifies us in the power of the Holy Spirit for a full experience of human living. Confirmation is conferred normatively upon teens in their sophomore year or through the OCI process for all those, children or adults, who are converting into the fullness of the Catholic faith. Sincere preparation must precede the reception of this beautiful Sacrament.

Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament of the Sick may be received after weekday or weekend Masses with prior notice. The Sacrament may also be celebrated in the Parish Office or with a personal visit to a home or care facility.

Sacrament of Marriage: Couples called to the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the Parish Office at least 6 months prior to the desired wedding date. Please make no firm arrangements until after meeting with the Deacon/Priest.


The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass

By an apostolic tradition taking its origin from the very day of Christ's Resurrection, the Church celebrates the Paschal Mystery every eighth day, the day that is rightly called The Lord's Day. On Sunday, the Christian faithful ought to gather together so, that by listening to the Word of God and sharing in the Eucharist, they may recall the Passion, Death and Resurrection of the Lord Jesus and give thanks to God who has given them *a new birth with a lively hope through the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead*. The Lord's Day is therefore the first and greatest festival, one to be set before the loving devotion of the faithful and impressed upon it, so that it may be also a day of joy and of freedom from work. Other celebrations must not take precedence over it, unless they are truly of the greatest importance, since it is the foundation and the kernel of the whole liturgical year.


GOD CALLS US

Reflection on John 1:29-34

The Christmas season has come to an end and we enter now this brief portion of Ordinary Time that unfolds before the Lent/Easter season is upon us. In Ordinary Time, we pay attention to the mission and ministry of Jesus in order to discover how each of us are called to be Christ's body in our time and place.

The prophet Isaiah tells us that we have been chosen and commissioned by God, "who formed me as his servant from the womb." And we recall how John the Baptist, featured in today's Gospel, leapt in his mother, Elizabeth's womb at the visitation of Mary, responding joyfully to the nearness of his cousin and our Lord, Jesus. Just as John was uniquely equipped by God for the mission he was given in life, so too are each of us equipped for our work, a process of formation and empowerment that began as we were formed in the wombs of our mothers, and indeed, has been part of God's design and plan for us even before time existed. Can you imagine yourself to be uniquely equipped, divinely fashioned, Spirit-driven for the work to which God calls you?

SAINT FRANCIS DE SALES*Saint of the Day: January 24**Patron Saint of Authors, Deafness, Journalists and Writers*

Saint Francis de Sales was destined by his father to be a lawyer. For this reason, Francis was sent to Padua to study law. After receiving his doctorate, he returned home and, in due time, told his parents he wished to enter the priesthood.

His father strongly opposed Francis in this, and only after much patient persuasiveness on the part of the gentle Francis, did his father finally consent. Francis was ordained and elected provost of the Diocese of Geneva, then a center for the Calvinists. Saint Francis de Sales set out to convert them, especially in the district of Chablais. By preaching and distributing the little pamphlets he wrote to explain true Catholic doctrine, he had remarkable success.

At 35, he became bishop of Geneva. While administering his diocese he continued to preach, hear Confessions, and catechize the children. His gentle character was a great asset in winning souls. He practiced his own axiom, "A spoonful of honey attracts more flies than a barrelful of vinegar."

Besides his two well-known books, *Introduction to the Devout Life* and *Treatise on the Love of God*, he wrote many pamphlets and carried on a vast correspondence. For his writings, he has been named patron of the Catholic Press. His writings, filled with his characteristic gentle spirit, are addressed to lay people. He wants to make them understand that they too are called to be saints.


In spite of his busy and comparatively short life, he had time to collaborate with another saint, Jane Frances de Chantal, in the work of establishing the Sisters of the Visitation. These women were to practice the virtues exemplified in Mary's visit to Elizabeth: humility, piety, and mutual charity. They at first engaged to a limited degree in works of mercy for the poor and the sick. Today, while some communities conduct schools, others live a strictly contemplative life.




